Walnut Mountain has long been known for its views from the mountain top.



In the 1896 issue of Summer Homes published by the O&W Railway, the listing for the Walnut Mountain House included the fact that it was one mile from the Liberty train station. “[A] private conveyance... will meet guests. A drive of twenty minutes over a smooth, winding roadway brings you to the Mountain House...”

The carriage road still leads visitors to the mountain top...keep going to find stop number 3.

Notice the side profile (Witches' Face) just under the feet of Mountain House Patrons.





